Unit 2 Phonetics and Pronunciation

Learning goals:

- Differentiate the pronunciations of regular verbs ending with 'ed'
- Be able to pronounce words based on IPA standards

As you know, the -ed suffix is added to regular verbs in English to form their past form. This -ed ending can be pronounced in three different ways: /id/, /d/ and /t/

Some clues to understand and to know how to pronounce –ed endings of regular verbs: past simple and past participle forms.

o If the infinitive or base verb ends in a /t/ or /d/ sound, the –ed ending is pronounced as /id/, adding an extra syllable. Examples:

Shout /shaut/ > shouted /shautid/ Want /wɔ:nt/ > wanted /wɔ:ntid/ Need /ni:d/ > needed /ni:did/ End /end/ > ended /endid/

The –ed ending is pronounced as /t/ if the infinitive or base verbs end in any of these sounds: $/\int/$, $/t\int/$, /s/, $/\theta/$, /k/, /p/, or $/f/\delta$ Examples:

Wash /wɔ:ʃ / > washed /wɔ:ʃt/
Watch /wɑ:tʃ / > watched /wɑ:tʃt/
Kiss /kis/ > kissed /kist/
Breath /bri:ð/ > breathed /bri:ðt/
Ask /æsk/ > asked /æskt/
Stop /stɑ:p/ > stopped /stɑ:pt/
Laugh /lɑ:f/ > laughed /lɑ:ft/

 The –ed ending of the infinitive or base verbs ending in any other sound (either vocalic or consonant) is pronounced as /d/ Examples:

Play /plei/ > played /pleid/ Travel /'trævəl/ > travelled /'trævəld/ Allow /ə'laʊ/ > allowed /ə'laʊd/
